The first day of summer 2019 arrives with the solstice on Friday, June 21, at 11:54 a.m. EDT. For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, this marks the longest day of the year so enjoy the long daylight! Fun fact: Be sure to look at your noontime shadow around the time of the solstice. It will be your shortest noontime shadow of the year!

The Editor by Steven Rowley is the story of a struggling writer who gets his big break, with a little help from the most famous woman in America—Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis. This is an original novel about an author whose relationship with his very famous editor will change him forever--both as a writer and a son.

Lost Roses by Martha Hall Kelly brings us more of the untold stories of women and families far away from the war front yet deeply affected by the decisions of leaders and the efforts of fighters.

The Mother-in-Law by Sally Hepworth is a suspenseful tale of fractured relationships and deep family secrets that grows more compelling with every chapter. The multilayered characters and the page turning suspense as clues are doled out make this a great summer mystery read.

Nanaville by Anna Quindlen is a candid, funny and frank work on the art of being a “grandmother”. The author, known for her insights into all stages of life, uses her own experiences to illuminate those of many others.

The Yankee Widow by Linda Lael Miller is the story of a young wife raising her child together with her husband on a farm just outside of Gettysburg. When her husband joins the Union army, she never anticipates he will not return. But when she receives word that her husband is wounded, she finds her way to Washington, DC to search for him. It is an emotional novel about one woman's courage and the choices she must make in the face of a dangerous war.
