



David's Corner

"And, beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, he expounded to them the things concerning himself in all the scriptures." Luke 24:27

Can you imagine yourself on the road to Emmaus shortly after the death of Jesus? You and your companion are trying to get your heads around the events of Jesus horrible death on the cross. The authority's intent was to totally deflate any hope you might have that this man was special; worth following. If there is a more apt expression than you were "sick at the stomach" I cannot think of it. This dejection was very deeply felt. One moment we are transfigured with Jesus in heavenly glory and the next we witness blood and vinegar below the cross. What we to do? We go home to lick our wounds and hope for something new in which to believe. A stranger comes into step with you on the path home. He inquires, "how things are going?" You are less than charitable. "How could you not know of the happenings in Jerusalem? Duh! Life is awful at the moment."

You have descended from the mountain into the dark night of the soul. This stranger hears you out. It takes some time for you to express your frustration and disappointment. The conversation turns and the stranger begins to speak to your wounded condition. Your bewilderment turns to understanding. You feel a renewed belief that what has occurred is not ended and is meaningful. Something changes, you are now optimistic that you can navigate future stormy waters and whatever comes next.

I think this is what we all desire. The future is best navigated by "watchful waiting." Finally, it is a belief that something more is, has been, and always will be going on and that my life is embedded in this foundational reality. This was the reality that Jesus explained to them on the road to Emmaus.
